### **NEW LAWS IN EFFECT FOR VESSEL OWNERS**

*Port to collect information; Tenants to carry insurance*

The Washington Dept. of Revenue now requires that, effective **June 12, 2014**, a moorage provider [the Port] that provides long-term moorage (more than 30 days)

### THE 2015 BUDGET PROCESS BEGINS



Review of the Port's Fee Schedule is the first step.

Under discussion are proposed changes to fees regarding:

dock boxes; launch ramp permits; electricity; facility use; office fees; cruise-ins; and July 4 moorage.

The 2015 Fee Schedule will be a decision item at the August 5 commission meeting, with an

must obtain the following information and documentation from those entering into or renewing long-term moorage agreements:

- Name and legal owner of vessel;
- Local contact information;
- Vessel Owner's address and phone number;
- Vessel hull I.D. number;
- Vessel Coast Guard registration, if applicable;
- Vessel's home port, country or state of registration and registration number;
- Date on which the moorage began; and
- Proof of vessel registration.



This information must be provided by the Port to the Dept. of Revenue (DOR), Natural Resources, or Licensing, upon request by those agencies. Additional requirements are listed in DOR's [Special Notice](#)

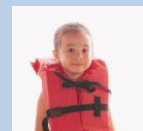
### ***Tips for Boating***

- > Be safety certified to operate a watercraft per the state's boating laws.
- > No drinking and boating.

According to the National Association of State Boating Law Administrators website, alcohol is responsible for 16% of boating fatalities, making it the leading contributing factor in recreation boater deaths. State officials are taking boating under the influence (BUI) laws seriously.
